

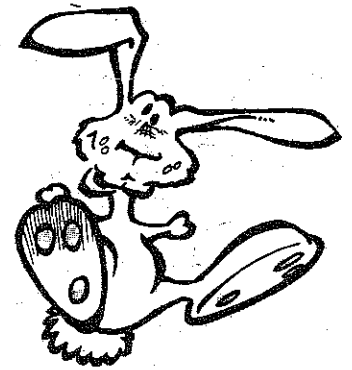

BE A TV STAR

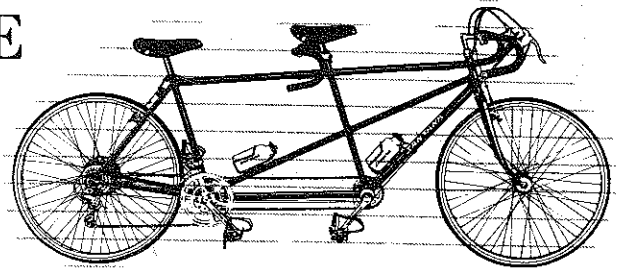

- APRIL 7 - Easter Sunday  
Sandra Cryderman will lead a 40 mile B pace ride to Belle Isle, with a breakfast stop at the Original Pancake House, located on Mack Ave., south of 8 mile, in Grosse Pointe. The ride will leave the NE corner of MCCC parking lot at 7:30 a.m. and will arrive at the Pancake House around 8:15. - APRIL 7 - Easter Sunday  
Al Barton will also lead an A pace, 50 mile ride to begin at noon. Meet at Al's house, his phone # is 979-6857.
- APRIL 14 - Come on a sweet ride with Ray Dominick. He will be leading a B+ ride, starting from Pavlats, to Memphis. His destination is McKiernans maple syrup farm. Breakfast will be in Armada which is 22 miles out, the total riding distance will be 60 miles. Ray's # is 776-2793.
