Right Hook

You have to watch out for those "right hooks" from cars that pass you to make a

right turn at the intersection. I wasn't paying close attention on April 1 at 22 mile and Van Dyke when a car passed then turned right in front of me. If only I had slowed or turned inside it faster. Should have noticed car coming around me before it was too late. I just got sideswiped lightly, but hit the ground hard. Car didn't get even get a dent. My helmet got cracked in the back, eyeglasses were bent and my seat is sore from sitting on the pavement suddenly. I can't ride much now, should be better in a couple weeks. The bicycle seems OK though.

Car driver was nice and we got together the next day for police report and his auto insurance. But it's better to avoid falling in the first place. Hindsight is 20-20, perhaps if I had been farther into the lane it would have been prevented. Van Dyke there has two lanes in each direction with center left turn lane. The right, outside lane isn't really wide enough for safe passing of car and bike, if you ride in middle of lane they might honk but at least they see you. They can merge into other lane to get around you. No reason to antagonize car drivers but you shouldn't cower by the gutter either. At least look back at intersections for cars that might be coming around but don't forget to watch for traffic in intersection turning left too. Remember to "Be Alert", we need more "lerts" (bad pun!) *Ted Gondert*

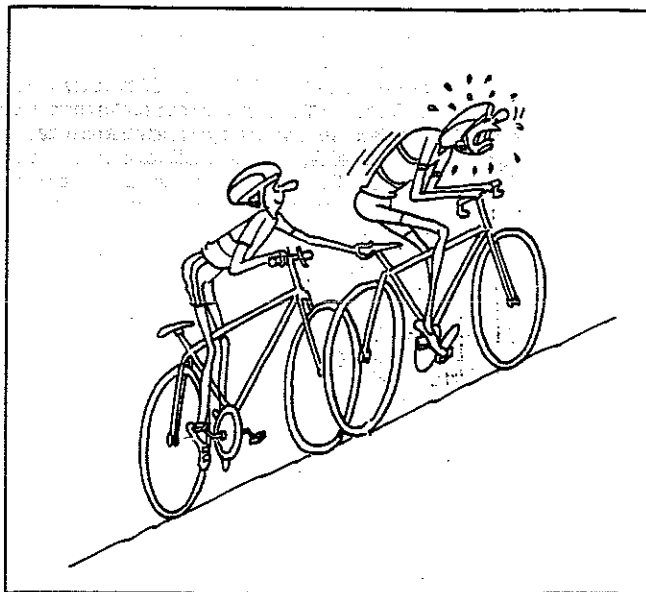

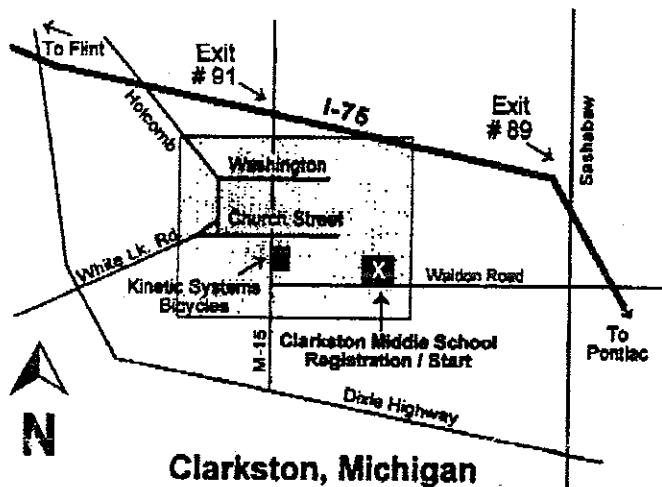
