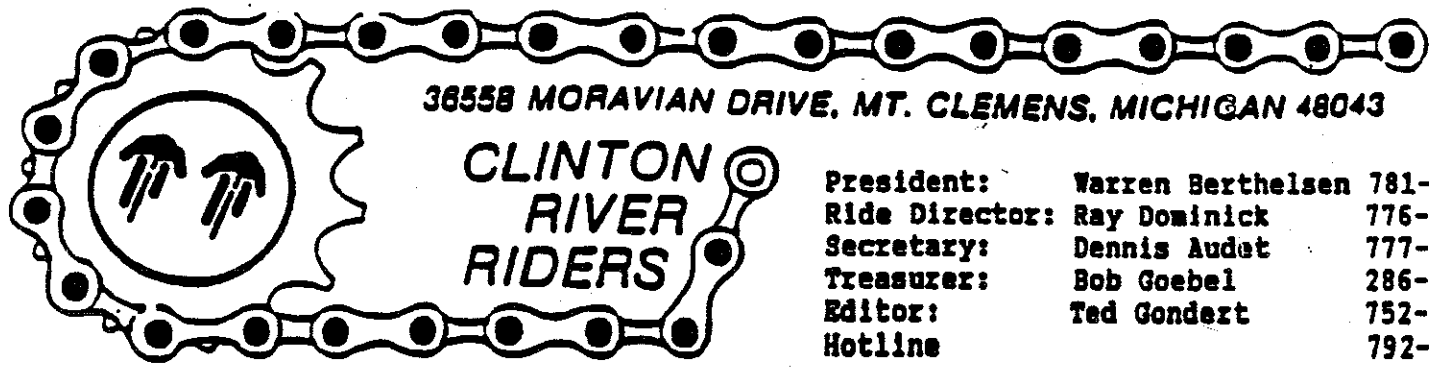

AWARDS: The club awards will be given at the end of the year for mileage and for club member of the year. There will be a plaque on display at Pavlat's bike shop with the top mileage award for the year and the club member of the year, men and women, engraved on it. The mileage award will be given to the top male and female riders with the most mileage. There is a mileage chart in this newsletter. Mileage for the previous month must be written and brought to the meeting and given to the

ride director, Ray Dominick, or mailed in by the end of the month. If the mileage is not given to Ray that month it will not be awarded. People must be club members and attend at least 10 club events such as meetings, rides, BWR envelope stuffing etc. and also must lead at least one ride. The Member of the Year awards will be based on the number of points a member acquires for club activities. Club officers get 5 points, Ride leaders with a new ride get 4 points, Ride leaders 3 points, Committee heads i.e. BWR mapping, rest-stops etc get 3 points. Workers for the BWR (Blue Water Ramble) get 2 points and participants at club rides and events get 1 point.

Bike Advocate: Bill HR2101 has been introduced in the congress by Joe Kennedy (D-MA) "The Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation Improvement Act of 1991" would require states to use 3% of their Federal Highway money for non-motorized transportation projects.

The bill #HR2101 is in committee and when we find out more we will publish the information in the newsletter The Clinton River Rider's Political Action Committe endorses this bill and asks for your support.

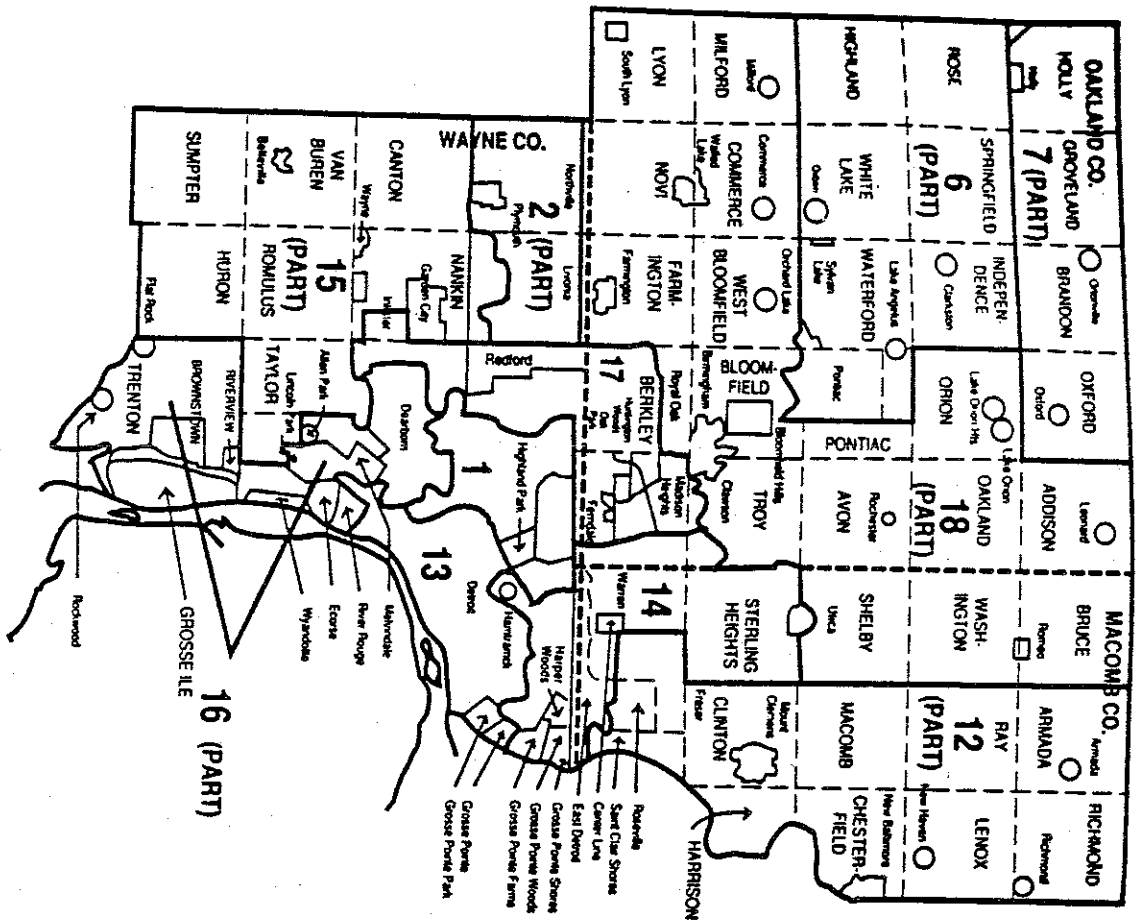

Dear Sir,

I am writing to express my support of bill #HR2101 submitted, by Representative Joseph Kennedy (D-MA), to amend the Surface Transportation Assistance Act. This bill would require each state to allocate 3% of the federal highway funds provided by this Act, for the creation and maintenance of bicycle road lanes, better road shoulders and separate bike paths. The allocation of funds for such projects would stimulate the advancement of bicycling for both pleasure and means of transportation. In turn, greater use of the bicycle would generate benefits such as conservation of fuel, reduction in pollution, lessen road maintenance costs, a greater national health and lessen bicycle accidents with motor vehicles.

I urge you to coordinate your efforts with other supporters of this proposal such as Representative David Bonior (D-MI) to enact this proposal. Thank you for your support and happy cycling.
