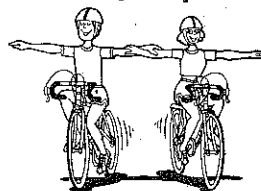

Sunday, Aug. 11 - BWR Pre-Rides

50 K - Ron Skiba will lead this route, which actually is 41 miles, beginning from St. Clair High School at 8:30 a.m. His ride will be a C+ pace with a brunch stop in Algonac.

100 K - Rick Moorman will lead this B pace ride from St. Clair High School at 8:00 a.m. Those who wish to ride more miles, may meet at the Riveria Restaurant on 23 mile and Gratiot at 6:00 a.m.

200 K - John Edry will lead an A pace ride from St. Clair High School at 7:00 a.m. Please eat before you leave, but there will be a lunch stop along the way.

Aug. 10 - 11 - A Capitol Event

ACE is a major gathering of bicyclists from around the state for a social event in Lansing. It is sponsored by Bike-PAC, the LMB's legislative affiliate. Participants will bike in from several cities to rally at the Capitol Saturday afternoon, then proceed to Michigan State University in East Lansing for dinner, the evening's entertainment, and overnight.
