Because of the unpredictability of good 'ole mother nature, if the weather looks questionable on the morning of the ride, call the ride leader to verify if the ride is still on.

Sunday, Oct 13 - Meet Sandra Cryderman and Ray Dominick to ride to Grosse Pointe to meet the marathon runners near Kerby and Kercheval. The ride leaves MCCC at 7:45 a.m., for a 40 mile, B pace ride. There will possibly be a breakfast stop, but be sure to eat a little something before you leave.

Sunday, Oct. 20 - Return to Otisville with Tim Woodby. This fast paced A ride of 100 miles, will have a lunch stop in Otisville. So eat breakfast before you start. Meet at Romeo High School for a 7:30 a.m. leaving time.
