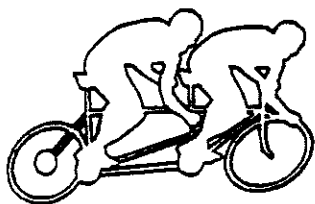

Walden School of Cycling

TJ Hill gave a talk about this bicycle training camp in Mt. Dora Florida. One week sessions start on the last two weeks of March and first two weeks of April. Attendees will learn bicycle handling skills for group/paceline riding, fast cornering by the Walden method, and some training on hills including a 15% downhill. Riders are separated into groups so you will ride with similar riders instead of trying to chase racers or waiting for the slower riders.

Stay in four person cabins, with meals in cafeteria provided and bike handling drills in nearby subdivision with longer rides on alternate days. Some afternoons off for sight seeing. Disney World in nearby Orlando, etc.

Cost is about \$450. More information available later.

CRR Mileage and Participation Awards

Rules:

1. You must be member by June 1st to qualify for 1996 awards
2. You must participate as a worker for BWR either prior to or day of ride.
3. You must participate in at least 10 club functions.

Mileage Awards:

1. Self monitored- must submit mileage cards.
2. 10% of total distance must be on club rides. Club rides include all club supported invitationals & all club rides posted on Hotline.

Participation Awards:

Based on a point system from club sign in sheets

1. Club Officers 5pts
2. BWR Committee head 4pts
3. Club Ride Leaders & CO-Ride leaders 3pts
4. Each ride, club event and meeting attended 1pt
5. Ride Leaders and Riders on invitationals 1pt
6. Sag Drivers for club rides 2pts

Youth Awards:

Awards by age only: 15-18, 11-14, and 10 and under.

1. Self monitored-must submit mileage cards. *

Commuter Awards:

1. Self-monitored-must keep track of number of days you commute to work & submit on mileage cards. *

* submit mileage cards minimum of 4 times a year at club meetings or by phone. all miles count.

Stolen Bicycle by Ted Gondert

Hind sight is 20/20. I should have locked up my Trek 970 mountain bike but I've ridden it for 6 years and never had it missing. It's inconvenient to lock it up every time you go somewhere. Left it in front of a store on Sunday, Sept. 22 in Romeo where it's been many times. This time when I came out it was missing. Also lost my blue Giro Express Rock Lock helmet. Jand mountaineering pannier. bicycle tools including a Cool Tool and cassette breaker. spoke wrench, etc. and electronics tools: Fluke 77 digital voltmeter, soldering iron, pliers, screwdriver, etc. Whoever stole it knows who it belongs to, my name was in my helmet. I reported it to the police and called Prestige cycles to find out the serial number. Next time I'll file that information away.

Does the person who stole it understand the loss of something you've enjoyed on many rides? The memories of centuries and trail riding, good times with friends and daily transportation. What did they get out of it: 50 bucks? Now I've borrowed an old Motebecane from my dad that doesn't fit me, but it's better than nothing. I still have my road bike but that isn't practical for everyday riding with cleated shoes.

I repainted the old 1989 model red Trek 22" 970 mountain bike last year because it was getting rusty. The wheels had been replaced. I laced up a Mavic 261 rim on the back this year. The front is a

Nashbar rim. Shimano Deore LX hubs. Replaced the rear derailleur with Shimano STX.. 7 speed Hyperglide with above bar thumb shifter. Black True Temper handle bars. Hand Ease handle bar grips. The fenders, rack and pannier made the bike practical and I thought nobody would want an old bike like that. I'll have to save up some money to buy another bike now, maybe just get a good used one, less likely to get stolen.

SEMCOG Bicycle Task Force advisory committee meeting

Alex Borgeau has asked to schedule the next Bicycle Task Force advisory committee to meet **Wednesday November 6th** at SEMCOG offices downtown.

For those that don't know, SEMCOG is the South East Michigan Council of Governments, representing the seven counties around and including Detroit. They are the MPO (Metropolitan Planning Organization) that is charged with developing the long range transportation plan for our area in accord with the requirements of state and federal regulations.

Non motorized transportation includes bicyclists, and this is our chance to add our concerns and recommendations to this plan. John Waterman of ARC, myself, Fred Dore, and Gary Halewyn met with Mr. Alex Borgeau a few weeks ago to begin this process. Dante Lanzetta was unable to make this meeting, but has been in the loop.

If you can attend this meeting, great. If not, this task force is looking for hard items that should be addressed by the plan. If there is a specific type of project in the works, or one that was recently completed that failed to adequately meet the transportation requirements of cyclists, then the example can be written into the plan to attempt to keep it from happening again.

What they are looking for is words that can be copied and included in the formal regional transportation plan. If the proper language is there, the next time your county road department gets going on a new road or a rebuilding project, or some other transportation related construction, the suggestions in the plan document will add some legitimacy to cyclists requests.

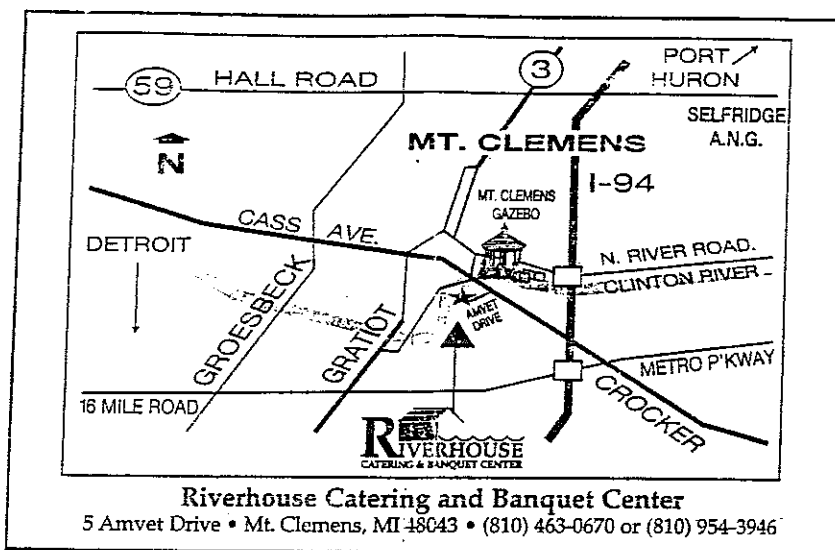
