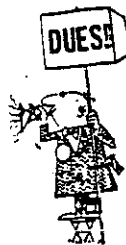

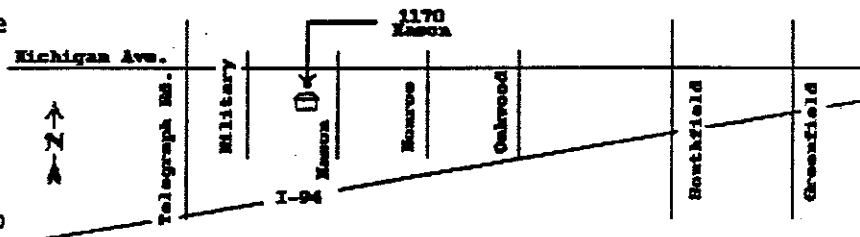

Bicycle School: The Walden School of Cycling. This is a bicycle training camp in Florida which Dale Hughes and Mike Walden have run for several years. The coaching staff at the camp can help you achieve your goals in cycling. Also a good vacation from the winter blues. Level 1 teaches basic bicycle positioning, pedaling techniques, bike handling etc.

Level 2 is advanced training for racing techniques such as drafting, race strategy, sprinting etc. Level 1 must have been completed before Level 2. The day begins with drills on techniques then longer riding sessions. Riders are grouped according to ability, experience and on-the-bike evaluation. One week sessions begin Feb 2 thru April 19, 1992. Cost is \$345 per week includes 6 nights lodging, 17 meals, coaching, video analysis, riding, sunshine and fun. CLINTON RIVER RIDERS FINANCIAL SUBSIDY POLICY

EFFECTIVE DATE: 1 / 1 / 1992 (proposed)

GENERAL:

It is not our intent to exclude anyone whose heart and spirit are in the best interest of the club. We do not by design suggest criteria which we believe are inconsistent with stated or implied club goals. We are suggesting a basic guideline for the clubs financial support of individual members when it pertains to items purchased by the club and partially or wholly subsidized by the club. This will not apply to items which the membership determines by vote to be exempt.

PURPOSE:

To insure club monies spent on special items and events (i.e. christmas party, picnick, jackets, jerseys, etc.) are distributed fairly to members whose eligibility is determined by being a:

1. A "CURRENT" member.

AND

2. A "ACTIVE" member.

DEFINITIONS:

A "Current" member: A dues paying member as defined in the by-laws.

A "Active" member: One who fullfills one or more of the following criteria.

Is a current club officer.

OR

Is a ride leader.

OR

Is a frequent substitute ride leader.

OR

Works on or participates in the organization of club events, (i.e. BWR)

OR

Has served on a club special committee within the calender year.

OR

Has been determined to be qualified by a club officer due to special considerations.

OR

Has accumulated at least 30 points as determined by the mileage, point award system.

CONCLUSION:

Our intention is to see that club monies for these items are disbursed in a fair manner. This will assure each deserving member the opportunity to be acknowledged for thier participation and effort.
