## Club Elections

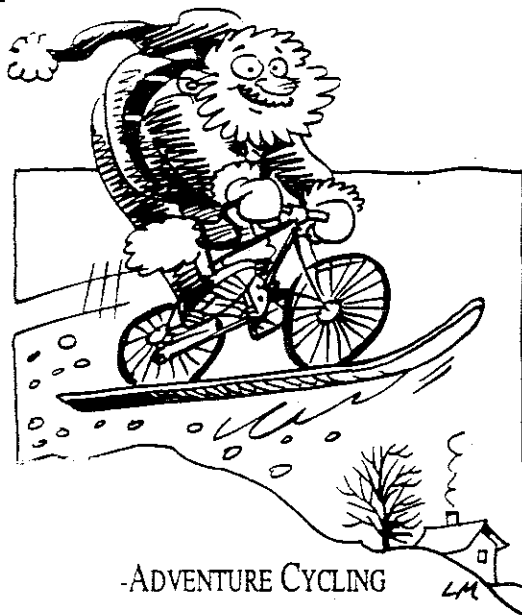

Thermometer hovering around 32 degrees - snow flakes in the air - beautiful. At 0859 only one "rider of the purple sage" has shown up. Where's the other Clinton River non-Riders? Executive decision - abandon! Purple executive allegedly heads for Stoney Creek for some dirt riding. I head home to gather provisions and stake my claim to the sofa for the MSU-U of M football game. Turning north on Gratiot I see a familiar vehicle pull into Digger's lot. Looks like the habitually late "Rad Rider". Turn around to inform him of the majority decision. He puts on a long face that would convince POTUS to bypass Hooters for Bill Knapps, and suggests going to Stoney for some light trail riding. Unfortunately my dirt wheels are laid up for bottom bracket repair. (Truth is, I haven't been off pavement all year) RR has the appropriate "coup fourre" (ref.

Parker Bros. Mille Bourmes) – an extra dirt bike in his basement. I reluctantly agree to go - should make it back for the second half.

Stop at RR's Ranch to pick up the bike - a vintage hard-tail Trek, (Even on pavement I've developed a preference for my Sofride beamer). This thing looks like SN0001 from Waterloo - upgraded with plastic pedals w/o toe clips! these gotta go. Install my SPD 737s. RR tries to contact the purple sage, with no luck so we proceed to Stoney where we meet Tom. He suggested going to Bald Mountain. (If I drop off halfway and head back I can still catch the second half) I start off hesitantly, trailing the others. An occasion calls for a handful of rear brake. Nothing happens! - look behind the seat - no caliper! Rad Rider assures me its there - just not hooked up - under the chain stays - the type OSHA outlawed in the fifties. Even hooked up it grips like slime on a glass door knob! Another astute observation - silent knobbies with ridge down the middle -great - on pavement!

Somewhere on Gunn Road I run out of fig bar crumbs but doggedly hang on past the point of no return. Victim of my legendary navigational skills, I'm doomed to experience Bald Mountain. I struggle to keep up, with some unplanned, poorly executed dismounts. Terrain is fantastic. Those CR nonRiders don't know what their missing! Heavy leaves on the trail, mud, rocks, tree roots, scenic bridges, and some "walkers" due only to lack of traction from silent knobbies! We meet up with TJ's group and have breakfast in

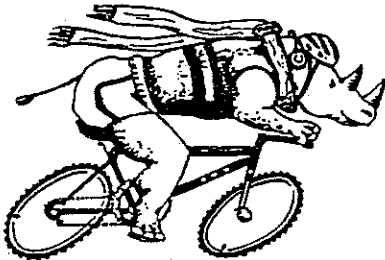

Got home after 3:30 - game over. Start preparing for next years annual dirt ride. Get new bottom bracket parts and catsup and horseradish - TJ's magic elixir! It better work.

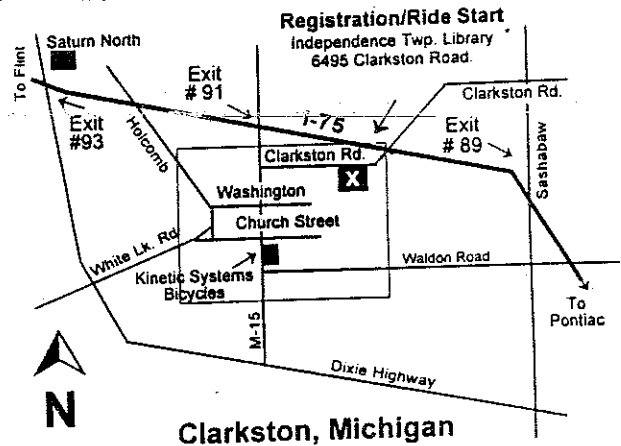

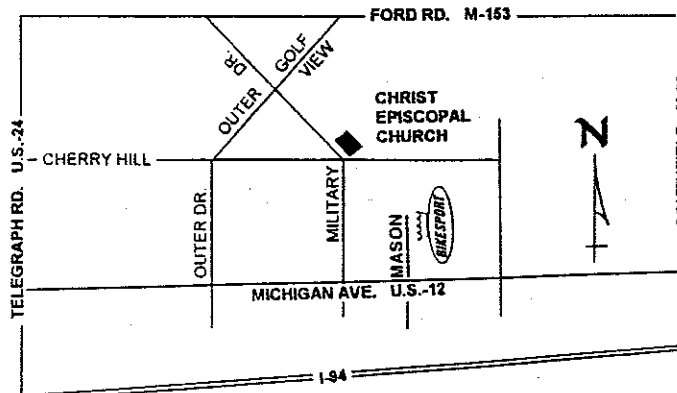



Please join Jerry & Sue Pavlat for a 4 day weekend in Wisconsin touring Trek Bicycle's two manufacturing facilities in Whitewater, WI and Waterloo, WI. We will see how Trek manufacturers their steel, carbon fiber, and aluminum frames using state-of-the-art laser technology, along with painting, wheel building, final assembly installing the components and boxing the bicycles for shipping.

Our first nights stay will be in Lake Geneva. The rooms are all non-smoking and have kitchen facilities, 1 queen size bed and 1 queen sized sofa sleeper. You can have one couple per room, or share with another couple. Bring something for breakfast Friday morning like: cereal, yogurt, bagels, muffins, fruit, juice, etc. Price of room is around \$50.

On Friday morning, April 25th, after breakfast, we will tour the Trek Factory in Whitewater. The tour is approx. 1 hour. After touring the Whitewater Factory we will eat lunch in Whitewater. Lunch is around \$7-\$8 and is included in the package price. After lunch we will head north to tour the Waterloo Factory which also takes approximately 1 hour. Trek will provide us with routes for those choosing to go for a ride in the Waterloo area. Afterwards, we will head to Madison.

In Madison we will be staying at the Holiday Inn/Holidome. All rooms at the Holiday Inn will be non-smoking. They will have one king size bed, or 2 double beds and are based on double occupancy. The Holiday Inn is a Holidome with an indoor pool, so bring your bathing suits. It is directly across from the largest shopping mall in Madison, which offers plenty of shopping, restaurants, and movie theaters. There are limited number of rooms with double beds. If you choose to share a room with another couple to cut down on expenses, it's first come first served. Base price of room with either one king size bed or two double beds is \$90. If you share with another couple, it's an additional \$20 per room.

On Saturday we will have several bike routes to choose from with various terrains. Trek will kindly provide the maps. Everyone is on their own to eat, ride, shop, etc. We could possibly meet inside the Holidome for dinner and share in the cost of pizza.

Sunday morning we could ask for a late check out, do a short, early morning bike ride before heading back home.
